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**SEVENTEEN FIFTH GRADERS AT GREEN VALLEY ELEMENTARY WERE INDUCTED
INTO NATIONAL ELEMENTARY HONOR SOCIETY**

Green Valley Elementary had their first annual induction ceremony for the National Elementary Honor Society on Thursday, January 12th. A total of seventeen scholars were inducted into the school's chapter.

To be eligible for membership consideration, students must have a cumulative grade point average of 94. Additionally, candidates must meet high standards of responsibility, service, and leadership.

Leadership is based on the student's participation in community or school activities or election to an office. To meet the service requirement, the student must have been active in two service projects in the school and community.

Students are reviewed by a faculty council appointed by the principal.

As members of NEHS, these students will now engage in a number of chapter service projects on campus and in the community.
